music. I also know, that in the music world, there are some "conductors" who do no more than beat time to whatever the band decide to play. However, a real conductor is an expert musician himself (herself), and actually "plays" the band or orchestra like а sensitive instrument: controlling tempo, texture, mood, volume; and conveying to the individual musicians, his (her) own feeling and desires. To do this, he has to be accepted by the musicians, and gain their loyalty, trust and willing cooperation and support. They have to choose him (her) and he (she) them. This is simply not possible if a different conductor (Minister?) arrives every week. It has to be a stable and permanent relationship.

Of course each musician needs to practice and develop his own "style". He may enjoy a bit of ensemble work. He may even perform an occasional concerto. The conductor too mav undertake some teaching or make some guest appearances: But the special, consistent, caring, guiding, encouraging (yes, and warning) relationship of Minister and congregation (that's what I'm waffling about) is absolutely essential. We may go on for quite a while, making it up as we go. We have many gifted "musicians"; but I am utterly convinced that we need the right person as OUR Minister. I beg you all not to lose sight of this vital objective.

The Canolfan Garden - Past Present and Future

The Canolfan garden was formally opened as the James Horsburgh Memorial Garden in 1976. For many years Peter Ferdinando did a sterling job of looking after the garden. He developed the garden during the period that the Canolfan was redesigned to celebrate Beulah's 150th anniversary and millennium in 1999/2000. 2013 Peter hung up his Canolfan gardening boots and at that point, Elaine Edwards, Dennis Richards and Ann Brown took on the job of looking after what was by then a mature and vigorous garden. Dennis has had to cut back his own role recently - his work in the garden has been greatly appreciated.



Peter Cruchley-Jones encouraged us with the 2015 theme of "Living Stones, Growing Gardens, Shaped by Christ". This also linked in well with the successful Eco-congregation initiative that has been led by Neil and Liz Kidd, Eileen Newington and many others. Our compost bins are well used and we are able to turn a combination of soft green garden waste and vegetable peelings from the kitchen into good compost which has been used around the garden to improve the soil.

More recently Ian McDowell has become involved and encouraged us to grow some edibles as "Mr Potato Head". The Junior Church, with Pat Cazenave and her team, had the children planting runner beans, courgettes, lettuces and other vegetables. The children had a great deal of pleasure from this and particularly enjoyed selling their produce for charity.

In 2015, Ann and Ian attended a ten week gardening course on "permaculture" techniques. This gave us a link with Michelle Fitzimmons from "Edible Landscapes". She came to work with us to help develop further the garden as a community garden. A laminated plan can be seen on the notices on the first floor of Canolfan.

We have added some new plants and now have a thriving herb garden. Neil (Kidd) does a great job of keeping the grass cut and topping up our three compost bins. We are now gradually filling in the gaps in the planting. Elaine has been working hard at filling planters and hanging baskets to fill the garden with colour. The "Men's Sheds" Group which meets on Thursday afternoons is renovating the garden seats and wooden planters.

Many people who have come across the garden have not realised it is there, tucked away in the heart of Rhiwbina. We are mindful that this is a memorial garden for many people. Our aim is to create a garden of peaceful sanctuary and community. It is there to be enjoyed by all ages.

Extra helpers are always welcome.

All-Age Junior Church, Sunday 19th June

Last month, we had a look at the word and idea of 'Beulah' in junior church. Beulah is a Hebrew word found in Isaiah 62: '.... you will be called Hephzibah, and your land Beulah; for the Lord will take delight in you, and your land will be married.' Isaiah is describing a New Jerusalem, encouraging the Israelites to engage in a bit of positive thinking at a time when they had returned from exile and were discouraged and fearful about the future. 'Beulah' is being used to describe marriage and reconciliation with God: the Israelites, their land and God were back in a right relationship with each other.



So ... we rolled up our sleeves and transformed tables, chairs and sheets into a land that we might want to live in. There was a (proper high) mountain, boulders, mountain pools and streams, green pastures, a river, sheep, people, trees, fish, birds boats ... even a turtle and an octopus! Not bad for half an hour's work, though we do say so ourselves.



Oh, and did you see our sheep? There's a rather lovely mountain sheep, which comes from mid-Wales, called the Beulah Specked Face. We made a big collage picture of one, from cotton wool and tissue paper, and put it at the foot of the stairs in the Canolfan. We hope ewe liked it!

Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals

We are fortunate in Beulah that we have a number of 'ministerial friends' who are willing to give their support to us for these services. We are used to having our own minister to call upon whenever the need has arisen, but we now need to think more carefully about how we approach these services.

After discussion with some of these friends, it is suggested that in future, requests for baptisms, funerals and weddings, that are to be held in Beulah, should be made through the church secretary, who will liaise with the celebrants to establish their availability.

In our tradition, as with Communion, elders and lay preachers may be authorised and trained to conduct baptisms, and we have several members who are authorised for this. Celebrants for weddings and funerals do not require authorisation from Synod, and the denomination is encouraging members from local churches to offer themselves for training.

It is inevitable that Beulah will need to begin to draw on our own lay resources in the near future to cover more of these services. We therefore need to identify people willing to contribute and develop skills in one, some or all of these areas. Our ministerial friends are offering to help us with this. If you feel this is something you might like to know more about and maybe explore informally, would you have a word with the church secretary.
