This service offered comfort and reassurance, but also contained the seeds of challenge, as we think about what that commitment FAMILY NEWS means in our lives, and how discipleship can be costly and unsettling in terms of comfort and certainty.

These will be based on a book by the theologian, Marcus Borg, 'Meeting Jesus in Mark', and will be an opportunity to meet together fairly informally and talk about the issues raised. Reflecting his belief that the decisive revelation of God is in a being, Jesus, human Borg explores questions about what looking at Jesus shows us about God, and the way of life into which that message of revelation leads us.

Our March 'Theme Sunday' will be on 12th March, and will be led by members of the Seniors Department of Junior Church.

The theme is 'Celebrating our Worldwide Partnerships' which has led us to explore 'mission' and 'missionaries' in various contexts past and present. Several members of the congregation have already been helping us with our research and we look forward to sharing what we have discovered.

Marion Williams, our Seniors Department Leader, has provided the following background information:

"The URC resources website for March highlights the story of the London Missionary Society:-

John & Mary Williams were missionaries in the South Seas sent there by the London Missionary Society (LMS). Although John was attacked and killed in the New Hebrides in 1839, their work continued through the John Williams ships operated by the LMS. The LMS had a series of small missionary ships, which transported missionaries and supplies through the mission fields, mostly in the Pacific. In the mid-20th century children from Sunday Schools in the UK, New Zealand and Australia raised money for the ships, collecting ship half-pennies (there was a picture a bit like one of the John Williams ships on the reverse of the coin)."

The following short prayer for March is a good one to carry with us in our day to day life:

Let us bring healing where it is needed Friendship in loneliness Love where there is hatred Peace to the broken places.




