

- update on Timescales

Our Feedback Forms were initially developed by the Transitional Ministry Support Group, and were then considered and amended by Elders' and Church Meetings. The Group is now working on Ministerial Proposals which will be discussed by Elders, and then brought to Church Meeting on 18th March after morning worship.

The new Regional Pastoral Committee for Cardiff will consider all the submissions by the end of April, and recommendations will be sent to the churches to consider in early May. We have a Church Meeting now scheduled for **Sunday**, **13th May after** worship to consider these proposals.
