

CHURCH NOTES

Holy Week and Easter were marked in Beulah in a variety of ways which helped us to enter the experience at many levels. Our Palm Sunday service was a joyful and lively affair as we gathered in Canolfan and then processed and sang our way over to church. The story was told in dramatized readings by our children, and the Senior Department helped us to make a 'tree' of footprints on which we had written some thoughts and prayers. Each night a small group met in the Whittaker Lounge to reflect on an aspect of the events of Holy Week which we linked to prayers about issues in our world today. On Maundy Thursday we were led through the communion by the Revd. James Hall through the telling of the events of that night as recorded by Mark. The symbolic 'stripping' of the table was particularly powerful, and we moved to the garden to hear the final words of the story before moving quietly away into the night.

On Good Friday we joined our friends from Bethany and All Saints in a Walk of Witness, beginning with a service in Bethany, moving on to All Saints and finally to Beulah, where our young people and their leaders told the story of the crucifixion in a dramatic recreation. This was followed by a soup and cheese lunch, which was a time of fellowship with friends from the other churches joining us.

Easter Sunday dawned fair and bright and we welcomed the Resurrection morning in the garden with a short act of worship followed by the Easter Breakfast. This was particularly special for our family this year, and I am so grateful to the Sweetnam and Sampson families (assisted by Youth Fellowship members) who have ensured that this decades old tradition has continued. Two

further services completed our Easter celebrations – a family service led by Revd. Roger Bidnell of joy and thanksgiving, and a quieter reflective evening service led by Dr Alun Jones. We walked the way through Holy Week together, and I am grateful to all the people involved who made this a truly memorable and meaningful Easter, which I am sure will help us as we journey forward in our exploration as to who and what God is calling us to be in our community here and in the wider church.



When we contemplate the world around us with growing concern over the escalation of tensions in the international community and no end in sight to the violence in Syria and the Yemen, we may wonder what the future holds for the world which God loves so much. As we sang on Easter morning our hope must continue to be 'From the fear of death and dying Christ has set his people free; The Lord is risen indeed' – and this is a message the world so badly needs to hear. In our lives and relationships let us make it known, with confidence and joy.

The Transitional Process:

We were pleased that about 80 members and friends stayed behind after worship on Palm Sunday for a special Church Meeting to discuss a suggested option for ministerial deployment to send to the new Regional Pastoral Committee when it meets at the end of April. This option was approved

overwhelmingly by those present, and we look forward to hearing back from the Committee in May.

A Transitional Day was held at Parkminster on April 14, which was attended by members from all the Cardiff URCs. It was good to meet and chat with friends from the other churches over coffee and lunch together. The morning session looked back on all that has happened over the past 18 months, and in the afternoon we heard from the Revd. Gareth Dyer who is the new Training and Development Officer for the Synod of Wales (South). He talked about discipleship and worship, and a meeting was arranged for Wednesday, May 23rd at 7.30pm at Synod Office. This is for all of us who are interested in developing a Cardiff-wide Worship Team – if you have been involved in leading worship over the past two years, I would encourage you to come along – this is one of our commitments given on our Feedback Form, and will help us identify the training and mentoring that we need to develop skills and confidence in this area.

I thought I'd write a little about KIN's history in case any of you are

wondering where the name came from and how long Beulah has been involved....

In 1960, Mrs Lillian Oldfield-Davies introduced Beulah to the work of the Welsh Friends of Refugees, a charity which had recently been set up in support of an international effort to meet the needs of many people throughout Europe who were still displaced and dispossessed as a result of the Second World War.

The Refugee Committee expanded its remit in order to help other charitable causes and, by 1963, had adopted the name Kindred in Need (KIN). This has developed into Beulah's major outreach organisation.

It is really good to see that we continue raising money for charitable causes that was started many years ago. I also know that many people from Beulah have been involved and supported KIN over the years.

In the recent Church AGM we were pleased to announce that Beulah raised £11,066 over the

last year.

Charities which benefitted included: Save the Children, UNICEF, Christian Aid, Space4U, Shelterbox, Healing Hands, Mencap, National Children's Deaf Society, McMillan Cancer Care (remember our murder mystery evening!!), NSPCC, Oxfam, Live Music Now (thanks to John Cheer for our Community Concert raising money for this charity), Samaritans, Action for Children, Huggard Centre (beautiful Christmas door decorations), CRUSE, Ronald MacDonald House and Health Help International (thanks to everyone involved in producing the Beulah Calendars).

So, thank you all. And a special thanks for Junior church who sell garden produce regularly and everyone who makes cakes, jams, chutney, soup, etc. for all the events we hold.

We ask for help and you continue to give and support.

Laura is very appreciative of all the love and support she gets from Beulah.
