

CHURCH NOTES

Beulah's journey towards and through Holy Week this year has been painful and emotional, but we have been touched by the many moving services where we have been offered hope and comfort. The funeral service for Elaine Edwards on the Tuesday of Holy Week saw a packed church as friends and family came together to offer thanks for her life and say goodbye to her. We are grateful to Ken Graham for leading such a heartfelt and sensitive service for a lady whose influence will go on in the lives of many people.

Our thanks also go to Jenny, who led such beautiful evening reflections in Holy Week and to James for a thoughtful and inspiring Maundy Thursday communion service. The Good Friday service led by our young people was deeply moving in its simplicity and clarity as we were led to glimpse the agony that Christ endured, and the suffering of those who loved him. This was preceded by a Walk of Witness which included services in Bethany and All Saints, where we contemplated the meaning of the day in front of the cross. Finally, on Easter morning we gathered in the garden to the singing of the blackbird and began to hear the message of resurrection. This was continued in our family worship, led by Roger, which included an Easter rap, and a dramatized reading between two caterpillars (!). Through our music and hymns, and the celebration of communion, we are given a way in to the unity that Christ brings and the hope of new life. The flowers were stunning – the displays from the wedding blessing reminding us of the hope that a young couple bring to marriage; the Christmon Tree more beautiful than ever, a sign of new life out of desolation, and

the lilies on the window sills were a lovely tribute to those friends and family members we have loved and lost through death, but whose influence continues.



As one of writers put in in our Holy Week reflection booklet, 'God had three hopes for his people through his Son: he hoped they would listen...learnand follow him. Then his will would be done on earth as it is in heaven. What a magnificent hope – something to pray for every day.' We are delighted that two ministers have responded to the invitation to 'preach with a view' in the Cardiff and Penarth Pastorate, and look forward to the weekend of May 10th and 12th when they will be visiting and leading worship. Information about the programme for the weekend is given later in Crossroads. We pray that the visit will be a sign of hope and new life for the pastorate as we begin to explore how we will be able to fulfil those hopes of God as united churches in Cardiff.

It was with great sadness that we learned of the death of Peter Stevenson this month. Peter has been an active member of Beulah for many decades, serving as Junior Church Leader, many periods as an elder, and his contribution to the fabric and contents of the sanctuary is evident all around us. He has also given service on other councils

within the United Reformed Church. We send our deepest sympathies to Ann, Gareth, Katie, Aled, Angharad, Magi, Lili Nel and Seth and remember them in our prayers. A service of celebration for Peter's life will be held on May 1st at 2.00pm in Beulah. Bright colours to be worn, please!

In the same week we also heard of the death of Robert Owen, who is well known in the community and the church - he was to be found most mornings sitting in the corner of the Whittaker Lounge, and will be missed by many. Our sympathies are also with his friends and family.

Further sadness in Holy Week came to Beverley Clay, whose mother has died – we remember Beverley and all her family in our prayers.

To all those known to members of our congregation, named and unnamed, who are in sorrow for loved ones, we send our assurances of love and support.

Some of our members and friends have been facing illness, and we continue to pray for Carol Coleman and the family as she remains critically ill in hospital.

“Continuing to profit from fossil fuel production is financially unnecessary and morally wrong; investing in the alternatives is the Churches’ prophetic responsibility.” *Christian Aid 2018*

Last September, you may remember James Buchanan from Operation Noah visited Beulah. He ran a workshop on the role Churches can play in the transition to clean energy and a zero carbon economy. He also spoke at our Harvest Service and has continued to help and encourage us as we consider Divestment. By moving our investments out of fossil fuel funds and into fossil free alternatives, Beulah could make an important statement. We would be demonstrating that we find it unacceptable to profit from organisations that are causing climate change. As a church we will be discussing these issues soon and I have resources and further reading for anyone who is interested. Let’s join with the other URC Churches and Synods who have already committed to Divestment and take a stand for climate justice.

Preach with a View Weekend – 10th-12th May

As you may know, the process for calling ministers to the Cardiff and Penarth Regional Pastorate has moved at quite a pace since Christmas, and, on the 10th - 12th May, the Regional Pastorate will be hosting the **Revs. Martha McInnes** and **David Dean**, a married couple, to Preach with a View. Brief bios of both David and Martha are included below.

This weekend will, of course, also be an opportunity for David and Martha to get to know us, and the other churches, and to consider whether the Cardiff and Penarth Pastorate calls to them.

On **Saturday 11th May**, David & Martha will be visiting Beulah between 12 noon and 2pm to view our Church & Canolfan – and to have an informal chat with the Elders. There will be the normal Saturday activities taking place, so members and friends may see them wandering around. At 2pm they will view our Manse.

There will be a number of opportunities for all of us from Beulah to hear and meet David and Martha in a range of different settings on **Sunday 12th May**.

These include:

10.30am Martha will be leading worship at Beulah
10.30am David will be leading worship at Canton Uniting

Whilst we are obviously hoping for a full house at Beulah, any members who would like to visit Canton to hear David will be very welcome to do so.

There will then be an afternoon and early evening of activities at **City URC** to which all congregations from all churches are very welcome:

1.00pm - 3.00pm A Bring and Share Lunch

3.00pm - 5.00pm Question and Answer Session

5.00pm Concluding worship led by both Martha and David

You are welcome to attend any or all of the activities at City URC. We will be pleased to try and arrange lifts to and from City URC – please let Andrew Glanfield know if you would like a space in a car or can offer a lift.

The following **Sunday 19th May**, we will be holding an Extraordinary Church Meeting straight after morning worship at which we will reflect on the visit and will vote on whether to call David & Martha to service in the Regional Pastorate. They would come as a couple so it will be a simple yes/no determined via a private ballot. All of the Beulah family are welcome to attend this meeting and to offer their views, but only members will be able to vote.

The other churches in our Regional Pastorate will also be holding church meetings on the

same day and the results of all the private ballots will be collated that evening. The threshold for the call has been set by the Regional Pastorate Committee as 80% of the whole vote plus 80% of at least four of the six congregations.

We very much hope you will be able to take part in some of the activities with Martha and David on the 12th May and will also be able to join us for the Church Meeting on the 19th May.

David Dean was born in Georgia, USA, into a traditional Baptist family. Following university, David moved to Louisville, Kentucky, to train for ministry. David then embarked on interim ministry work and worked for an AIDS organisation in North Carolina.

Martha McInnes was born in Iowa, USA, but spent her childhood in Northern California and Kentucky. Martha did not grow up in the church, but felt a call to ministry during university and returned to Louisville to train for ministry, where she met David. Following her training she worked at a hospital chaplain and it was in that time that David and Martha married and found the United Church of Christ as a faith home.

Following their ordination into the UCC in 1990, they worked together in a small town in North

Carolina where a friend encouraged them to think about a call to the URC. In May 1993, they visited the Wirral and were called to two churches there, Prenton URC and St. George's URC. In 1999, David was called to be the Free Church chaplain at Aston University and shortly afterwards Martha was called to Sutton Coldfield URC.

After some time in the West Midlands, in 2005, Martha and David, and their daughters Hannah and Amelia decided to return to the USA. David was called to a campus ministry in Florida and Martha became the director of a small charity for homeless families.

Life changed again in 2011 when the family decided to return back to the UK. Hannah was already back in the UK at university when David was called to work with an interfaith organisation in Leicester, the St. Phillip's Centre. David was also called to a small congregation in Leicester. Martha became the minister of Wellingborough URC. When David's role in the St Phillip's Centre ended, he became a

chaplain at Northampton General Hospital. Recently, Martha has taken a post as a hospice chaplain.

David makes regular pilgrimages to Taize and both David and Martha have been to Iona a number of times. David loves the Bible and enjoys sharing his knowledge with others through Bible studies. Martha is a trained spiritual director. They feel their ministries have always been about working with others to enhance the spiritual life of the local church and connect with people, inside and outside the church.

Because Martha grew up in Northern California, she never minds a cloudy or rainy day. On the other hand, neither of them mind a British Summer, no matter how hot or humid it seems. David is an avid football fan, supporting Tranmere Rovers through thick and thin. Martha enjoys a variety of crafts and recently discovered making fused glass pieces. Both enjoy exploring new places and spending time with family and friends

Spring Synod – 2nd March 2019

The Synod meeting was informative and uplifting. It began and ended with worship and amongst those remembered in the prayers was Tony Vinall.

The day started with a **Bible study** led by Revd John Proctor (General Secretary of the URC) on how we are all Holy Saints and was spiritually enlightening and moving. The text of this is available on the URC website <https://www.urcwaales.org.uk/news/saints-gods-holy-people>

The **local church Stories** throughout the day were very interesting. Phil Wall of St David's Uniting Pontypridd spoke about ways in which to encourage and support people that did not rely on a sermon! In Pontypridd they have film and chat evenings based on a series of short films on religious topics.

St John's in Tenby recently ran a creative arts project including a knitted Bible exhibition. They harnessed the skills of the church, local community and schools including Tenby Lifeboats.

Tabernacle in Pembroke have been working with Syrian refugees, welcoming 3 families and helping them settle in the Pembroke community. The church offered support as well as fellowship and a drop-in facility which provided advice on daily living. The families have settled in well and have been sharing their culture with the community via food and social events.

Barry Uniting discussed the development of their community garden from a derelict piece of land to a beautiful garden providing vegetables, a pond for

wildlife and a place to worship and rest in.

The final talk by Uniting Church, Rhyl outlined their work with community partners such as the police, Citizens Advice (which has a base in the church), social services and other bodies.

There were presentations on the upcoming **Big Day Out** on 29 June 2019 in the Royal Welsh Showground and on **Stepwise** the programme of study presently being developed by the URC for all members.

Around all this there was the routine administrative business of the church where all church secretaries present had a vote. I accompanied Louise Morgan and was very grateful for the opportunity to observe the Synod in action.


