

CHURCH NOTES

'Flowing streams, bringing life'

These words from Ezekiel were chosen as our theme for 2019. At the February Church Meeting members enthusiastically discussed ideas which we might explore during the year and these were collated and printed in the April edition of Crossroads. As we are now half way through the year, I thought it would be a good time to review what has been attempted so far.

Worship: Theme services took place in January, February, April, May and June, and more are planned for future months. Each of these has explored the theme in different ways, with continuity being provided by the opening words and hymn written by Alun.

Creative: In April, Gaynor presented two beautiful pulpit falls which she (with others) had made to illustrate the flowing stream. Jo Jones and her team of Ninja Knitters are busy creating a piece of work which will be displayed in Canolfan when complete.

Young People: Youth Fellowship went on a 'stream walk' noting what they saw, and this information is being used by the knitters. The young people also made a beautiful collage for the poster which was taken to The Wales Synod Big Day Out to illustrate Beulah's life of discipleship.

KIN/Junior Church: the children are raising money to 'twin' a Canolfan toilet with one in a developing country – please bring your silver change to church to help them with this.

Social: a Church walk is being planned for July 13 along a river – more details later in Crossroads.

These were just some of the ideas which you thought of – to remind us of the others, the list is printed again in this edition. Please take a look at it and see if you are inspired to have a go at any of the other ideas listed – if so, please let me or Anne James know.



Work is continuing at the RPC (Regional Pastoral Committee) to make the arrangements to welcome our new ministers to the Cardiff Pastorate. The Revds. Martha McInnes and David Dean plan to move to Cardiff in August, which will give them a little time to settle down into their new home in Nant-y-Wedal, before they begin work in September.

Their Induction Service will be held in Beulah on Saturday, October 12 at 2.30pm, where we will welcome friends from the other churches in Cardiff, as well as guests from the wider church, and be host to refreshments afterwards. For this service Martha has asked that each church bring some water from a place that is special in some way. Over the summer each of us is invited to collect a small amount of water (quarter of a cup full) – each church will collect their congregation's contributions which will then be brought to the induction service and mixed together as a sign of our unity. Details of how we will arrange the collection of water will follow later

– and how lovely that this idea links so well with our theme – perhaps a symbol of bringing life to our new pastorate.

At our Church Meeting in June we were asked to approve the proposal that Beulah should divest from any investments we hold in fossil fuels, and to encourage others to do the same. After some discussion the proposals were overwhelmingly approved – I would like to thank the Eco-Group for all their hard work with this, but most especially Eileen Newington who has worked tirelessly on our behalf to research and present the case for this. We may be the first church in Wales to make this decision, but we hope that others may soon be following, especially as Mission Council in May passed a motion that the URC should divest from fossil fuel companies and increase investments in renewable energy. This, too, is a sign of our concern for the life of our world and all those who live in it.



The Meetings took the form of Prayer, Bible Reading, a Guest Speaker, and ended with tea and biscuits. There was always a Bring and Buy Stall to raise money to pay for a Speaker.

On the nearest Monday to St. David's Day, Women's Fellowship held a luncheon in the then 'Assembly Rooms' and invited

guests to join them in celebrating Wales' Patron Saint, St. David.

Every year, Women's Fellowship went on a Day's Outing which everyone enjoyed. Lydia Morgan Jones and Ann Hughes put on plays at Christmas, in full costume, which were good fun. Once a year, on their Anniversary, Women's Fellowship took the evening Service.

The Fellowship flourished for many years where the weekly
