Dear Friends,

how do you feel about life at the moment? This past year has been extraordinary. We have learned new things and been isolated in our homes. We have worked flat out and found new ways of working, sometimes through screens and sometimes with masks and gloves. We have celebrated vaccines and mourned deaths of people we love. It has been a year of simple things and a year of previously unimaginable things.

And how do you feel now as you are invited to re-enter society, to go on holiday, to be in groups of people, to sit down with friends in their homes or a cafe/pub? Some of us can't wait to do everything we have missed over the last year and a bit. Some of us may be a bit hesitant to restart everything we used to do. When asked whether they would be returning to church, more than one person has said, 'Not yet.'

What have you missed in the last year? David might say he missed all the activities, being out and about seeing people and chatting at church events. Martha might say she missed meeting a person or two for a drink and a chat. What have you missed? We would both say we have missed regular visits with family.

Together we have managed to do some amazing things, getting online, have coffee mornings, musical events and quizzes as well as worship. We have found ways to raise funds for Christian Aid and other organisations. We have been inventive and creative.

As we pick up strands of our personal lives and our church life, we have an opportunity, created by the pandemic, to continue to be creative. We don't have to do everything we used to do. We can continue to try new things, to meet in different ways, to celebrate God's continued presence with us and between us.

Now that we are meeting regularly in church again, we are looking for volunteers to read the Bible lessons and lead prayers of intercession.


Helen White has kindly agreed to draw up the rotas, so if you able to offer to do either of these things, please can you let her know as soon as possible.



# INTERNAL REDECORATION OF CANOLFAN CENTRE

You will no doubt remember the discussions on finance at our Church Meeting on 28th February 2021, where I offered a saving towards the projected overspend for 2021, for the internal redecoration of the Canolfan Centre to be carried out by volunteers, instead of appointing contractors. During the meeting 12 people volunteered to help with the decoration, and their kind offer was duly acknowledged.

However, Level 4 Covid restrictions were in place at the time, and I thought it safer to wait until restrictions were reduced to Level 3, which permitted the re-opening of Community Centres, and the holding of 'organised groups' for up to 15 people to meet

safely.

Covid restrictions were reduced to Level 3 with effect from 3rd May, and as no bookings for the Centre had been made, it was agreed to hold the opening until 17th May, to allow time for the internal redecoration to proceed.

As soon as the 'green light' was apparent, I contacted all of the people that had volunteered, to arrange a suitable programme for our 'organised painting group'. Unfortunately, some of the original volunteers were not available, and our group moving forward were Marianne Barwise, Colin Grimes, Helen Harries, Fiona Liddell, Chris and Anne Wilkes, and myself.

I am extremely grateful for all of the effort put in by everybody, and in particular to Chris who helped me with all the preparatory works, and to those who were working full time, but still gave of their time in evenings and weekends.

As a consequence, we were able to achieve our goal, and to apply 65 litres of paint to brighten up the Canolfan Centre, and ensure it opened on schedule on 17th May.
