Dear Friends,

April 2022

Poet and farmer Wendell Berry wrote these words, in Manifesto: The Mad Farmer Liberation Front:

So, friends, every day do something that won't compute. Love the Lord. Love the world. Work for nothing. Take all that you have and be poor. Love someone who does not deserve it. . .

Put your faith in the two inches of humus that will build under the trees every thousand years. Listen to carrion – put your ear close, and hear the faint chattering of the songs that are to come. .

Laugh. Laughter is immeasurable. Be joyful though you have considered all the facts...

Practice resurrection.

As we approach Easter, we find ourselves thinking about Jesus' resurrection and what resurrection means for us. Two years ago our world was shut down so swiftly. We entered the silence of Holy Saturday. We experienced loss, but we didn't know what was next. We waited, possibly impatiently, for

the emptiness and isolation to end.

Today we face into a new time—one in which we 'live with the virus' and wars are being waged across the globe. We are no longer waiting in Holy Saturday, but how do we live as people who followed the Resurrected Jesus in this time in which we may still be afraid or uncertain?

I think Berry offers us some wise advice. Do things that don't harm us, but don't always make sense. Love that grouchy neighbour who doesn't want to say, 'hello.' Take them a cake—unless they are diabetic! Find ways to laugh together—have fun! What brings you joy? Do it! Notice the beauty of the earth. Watch the leaves unfurl on the trees in your garden. Notice the colours of the flowers. Take a walk and feel the sun on your face. 'Be joyful though you have considered all the facts.'

Practicing resurrection is finding a way to love and be joy-filled despite what may be happening around us. Perhaps we began to learn how to do this in lockdown.

Sing a New Song

As a church we have chosen to adopt a theme: 'Sing a New Song.' As we begin to engage with this theme, we may wonder what this means for us? Does it literally mean learning some new songs for worship? It might mean this, but it is broader than that.

For me, reflecting on 'singing new songs,' means this: We have lived, and learned, through two years of the Pandemic. We are now watching a war unfold on the edges of Europe. We are wondering how we face the economic changes to our society. We these questions and some more personal questions, we are wondering how this connects with us as people of faith and how we do church. We have changed, and are changing. How do we 'sing a new song'? How do all these changes connect with what it means to be a community of faith.

'Singing new songs' is about finding a way to be church that fits us. It is about finding opportunities to praise and lament. It is about being creative. It is also about the continued journey of faith. We find ways, new and old, to encounter the life-giving love of God.

Howard Thurman wrote the following words:

The old song of my spirit has wearied itself out.
It has long ago been learned by my heart;
It repeats itself over and over, bringing no added joy to my days or lift to my spirit.

I will sing a new song.

I must learn the new song for the new needs. I must fashion new words born of all the new growth of my life – of my mind – of my spirit. I must prepare for new melodies that have never been mine before, that all that is within me may lift my voice unto God.

Therefore, I shall rejoice with each new day and delight my spirit in each fresh unfolding. I will sing, this day, a new song unto the Lord.

He wrote them in 1973 as he watched people respond to challenges, i.e. inflation, price rises, political scandals, and international conflicts. He saw that the old song wasn't going to work anymore. He was ready to create a new song for a new time. So, as a community of faith, the theme challenges us to engage with a continued journey, listening to where we need to try something new or where we need to affirm old traditions or where we simply need to be

Learning a new song takes experimentation and practice. We might try a melody that we find doesn't quite fit with the lyrics. So we have to keep working on it until we get both melody and lyrics right. Then the song has to become lodged in our hearts. We have to practice and sing it again and again until we know it by heart. Both creating the song, modifying it, and learning it take time.

I wonder what the new song we sing will be? It could be, 'Do less, spend more time with each other.' It could be, 'Find a way to affirm what people do outside the church and create a space for refreshment at church.' It could be, 'Focus on one programme rather than lots.' There are many options. We are in a different place—changed and continuing to change because of the world around us. How best do we respond as Beulah URC? Psalm 137.4 says, 'How shall we sing the LORD's song in a foreign land?' We are in a different 'land' now. What is the song we will sing together? As we gather, we worship, we laugh, we work, we cry together, we will sing and discover God's song for us.
