

#### Letter from the Manse

#### Dear Friends,

ith wildfires raging, limited rainfall, searing heat, war just over the horizon, politics shaped far from our influence, it would not be surprising if we feel a bit worried about the future of our world. We have, over the past few weeks, wondered together what kind of world our children will be living in in 20-30 years. Will this strange summer be the norm or will the tide turn in a different direction. And what can we do to make a difference?

Making a difference may take the form of eating local and seasonal produce, changing our spending habits, driving differently and taking public transport. While we support each of these, we still wonder how our little lives can make a difference.

The author, Anne Lamott wrote, 'Hope begins in the dark, the stubborn hope that if you just show up and try to do the right thing, the dawn will come. You wait and watch and work: you don't give up.' This, it seems, is our calling—to be people of stubborn hope, showing up in the world where life seems hopeless and pointing to God's love.

This 'stubborn hope' is why Beulah continues its work around climate change. This

is why the Grown, Not Flown Flower Festival is so positive. This is why, even when there are more coffee shops springing up, the option of coffee and cake in the Margaret Whittaker Lounge is important. This is why the open garden is important. This is why Graffiti Jesus, yarn bombing and community art projects remain central to our work. This is why Theology on Tap was started. They are all about connecting with each other and connecting with the community. Each in its own way offers hope and light and points toward God.

Lamott says—'we wait, and watch and work.' It would be easy to give up or to bury our heads in the sand, but God calls us out to read the world around us and find opportunities to respond. Each of our programmes has developed from just such waiting and watching and has become our work of hope. God calls us be continue to be messengers of hope despite times feeling barren and empty.

For many people the most meaningful support often comes through spending time with others who truly understand from experience the emotional and practical challenges which losing someone close brings, engaging in activity, and connecting with and enjoying the natural world.

It's well established that exercise, fresh air, and enjoying the company of others can all combine to provide invaluable support.

So come and join us and help us launch our 'We Walk Together', Bereavement Support Walking Group.



We will meet at 2.00pm on the first Wednesday in each calendar month at the Scott Memorial, Roath Park Lake, Cardiff. All the dates are listed at the top of this invite.

The walk will take place regardless of the weather on the day (just wear wet gear and bring the umbrella if need be). The plan will be to go for a stroll around the lake. A circuit of the Lakeside is about 1.6 miles. Rest assured this is not a ramblers group, we will go for a stroll and ensure that the pace accommodates all involved. At the walks conclusion we will gather for refreshments at the Terra Nova cafe which is located in Roath Park.

The group will be supported by myself (Mark Jones, Solace Bereavement Support, Mental Health Services for Older People, Cardiff and Vale University Health Board) and Health Board Volunteers.

But most importantly this will be a Walking Group to be shaped by all those participating. This will be your group. Over the months as the group grows we can together agree new walking locations. But to get us started in 2022 we will meet at the Scott Memorial in Roath Park.

The Roath Park Lake site is renowned as a habitat for swan, geese, and overwintering birds including Mallard, Great Cormorant, and Herons.

### To: All members and adherents of United Reformed Churches and our Local Ecumenical Partnerships

Dear Friends,

Is anyone back to normal?

After two years of pandemic and lockdown, and Covid still with us (thankfully, for most, in a much weaker form), we can now worship together in person and find fellowship again. But for most of us it is not simply a return to how it used to be; some people have not returned to church, some have died or become too frail, some churches have closed and others considering it.

Now we have significant European turmoil and its likely effect on fuel and food prices for us in the UK.

Thank God that "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Heb. 13 v.8). Whatever else changes, He is our rock, our cornerstone.

Financially, things were extremely tough for churches in 2021. Plate offerings had collapsed; some regular givers had to reduce or entirely stop giving to support God's work; and those churches which hire

out their premises had seen income from that source disappear. Even those churches where the majority of the giving was by standing order or bank transfer (if you have not considered regularising your giving in this way, please do – it helps your treasurer significantly) may have seen a 20%+ drop in income.

If this had been replicated in giving to the M&M Fund in 2021, we might have been faced with a serious financial crisis last year.

But no, through the generosity of individuals, churches and Synods, we can report that income only fell by 4.4%. With a similar reduction in expenditure the M&M Fund result was a deficit of only £80,000 (less than one-half of one percent of income), a deficit that can be comfortably covered by reserves.

So, thank you to all who continued to contribute to your local church, thank you to all those churches who met their commitment for 2021 in full, and thank you to all those who, in adversity, continued to treat the M&M Fund as the first priority and paid what they could.

With churches and individuals under financial pressure, 2022 is not going to be an easy year

either. The M&M Fund budgeted income (based on Synods' projections) will not be sufficient to cover expected costs and we are reconciled to dipping into our reserves more seriously as a result.

However, if we "ordinary Christians" are to fulfil the call of Jesus to be His witnesses in the world around us we need ministers and other workers "on the ground" and we need shared resources which are often best created centrally. That all comes from the M&M Fund.

Again, thank you all!

#### **FINANCE MATTERS**

s you will see elsewhere in Crossroads, the URC have sent a letter thanking all churches for their support during the past couple of years. I would like to add Beulah's thanks. I have said this at various meetings but I would like to reiterate mine and the Finance Committee's grateful thanks for all of those of you who have continued to support the Church with your giving in various ways throughout what has been, and continues to be, a difficult time.

Covid has changed many things and we feel that the time has come to review how we deal with regular giving and other donations in the Church. As you will know, we have already dispensed with an offertory collection during worship, but there are collection plates in the Church porch for you to use. We have also taken the decision to do away with the weekly envelopes as only 3 people have asked for them for them in this financial year and they cost a considerable amount of money to have printed. If you really would like an envelope, then please use one of the vellow gift aid ones or speak to me and we can give you some of the ones that have not been used over the past 2-3 years as only the date will differ.

We are currently investigating the use of card readers which

may be useful for some of you. However, the majority of members and friends choose to pay by monthly Standing Order. This is a great help to me and easier for you as you can decide what you can reasonably afford each month and change it at any time should your circumstances change. But, whatever, method you choose — occasional, weekly or monthly — by BACS, cheque or cash - your generous giving is much appreciated.

Again, the majority of you who are able to Gift Aid are already doing so but, if you are not but would like to do so, please contact me for more information or a Gift Aid form. As you will be aware Gift Aid is an essential part of the Church's income.

My apologies that I am not always available in Church at present but I am always available on the phone or by email. My contact details are in the Beulah Directory.

Thank you to you all for taking the time to read this article.



Stan Stennett's son Ceri has written two books about the names on the war memorial in the gardens of Whitchurch library. The second book as seen on the photograph was published in November 2021 . I was in contact with Ceri Stennett in 2020 as he needed more information about my uncle Emrys Williams .

Emrys was the younger brother of my mother Denie Leech, they grew up in 'Westwood', Beulah Road, Rhiwbina. In December 1943, Emrys tragically died at just sixteen years of age, he fell down the hold of a ship and had only joined the Merchant Navy six weeks before as a cadet and had only been on the ship for one week.

I was able to give Ceri these details and also gave him a lovely photograph of Emrys in his uniform which you can see in the photograph at the bottom of the front cover of the book, so young and innocent.

Emrys was a well-liked young man in Rhiwbina and a member of the 1st Rhiwbina Scouts, maybe some of you may have known him.

Each person on the memorial is written about, you may have a family member on the list, such a tribute to all those who lost their lives during the Second World War.

A final chapter in the book is about Richard George Fice from Rhiwbina, a talented musician in the Royal Marines who died in 1989 in Kent by an IRA bomb. An annual memorial concert is held in Whitchurch High School in his name.

His name was added to the memorial and is the only one not connected to either of the World Wars .

#### EFOD ride - I did it! Thank you all

orry to have taken more than a month to update you all, but I'm very pleased to confirm that I completed the EFOD cycle ride on 9th and 10th June. The photos below hopefully give a small flavour of it.

As anticipated, it was pretty challenging. Day 1 was definitely harder than day 2. Much more hills, a seemingly almost constant headwind (despite the route travelling east, then south, then west?!), and a brief spell of bucketing rain. The scenery was amazing though – very remote mountain passes,

the Elan Valley and then Llyn Brianne reservoirs, etc. Chance encounters included a vintage Porsche rally (we lost count after about 50 cars passed us!), and the 'human versus horse' race near Llanwrtyd Wells. Leaving Aberystwyth at 8am, I rolled thankfully into Lampeter about 6.30 pm after about 105 miles. We had climbed over 10,000 feet – or nearly 2.5 x the height of Ben Nevis.

Day 2 was **only** 95 miles, and quite a bit less hilly. We still crossed the Black Mountains, and then the Rhigos and

Bwlch passes closer to home. The weather was better and we rode together more, maybe because we needed company on the long climbs! I felt very much accepted by the other riders, even though many of them were 20-somethings from Arup (a firm of engineers who organise the ride). There were a few oldies like me too, I'm glad to say. A few had travelled far to take part, one from Kent! A final word must go to the organisers and support crew, who made it the enjoyable event it was. The sight of a van in a layby in the middle of nowhere stocked with food and water really helps raise the spirits! University accommodation and food was also great – I'm not sure I'd have coped on the first EFOD in 2010 when they camped.

Many, many thanks to all who have given to the charity so generously. It does make it all worthwhile. I'm not exactly sure how much I've raised (as some donations are understandably anonymous) but it's around £400 from church which is amazing, and well over £2000 in all.
