The person(s) will need to be flexible, computer literate, and enjoy meeting and dealing with people. Our clients are very important to us and many have been using our premises for a very long time.

JOB DESCRIPTION

- Overall management of the Canolfan Monday to Friday, including help with opening and locking the building from time to time.
- Take and record all bookings: by email, telephone, or verbal.
- Pass details of bookings to the Treasurer where required to enable the raising of invoices/receipts.
- Monitor the diary to ensure no overlap of bookings.
- Meet any potential new clients.
- Deal with heating cycles

which are in place to conserve energy.

- Deal with queries and reported faults and ensure they are dealt with appropriately.
- Liaise with the Caretaker and the Cleaner.
- Liaise with the Premises Management Group.
- Order supplies of hand towels, toilet rolls, soap.

The Treasurer is currently dealing with all bookings and will be happy to talk with anyone who is interested in this post.
