

Green Flag Community Garden Award for Canolfan Beulah Garden, Rhiwbina



Keep Wales Tidy has unveiled this year's Green Flag Award winners – the international mark of a quality park or green space. 127 community managed green spaces across the country have met the standards needed to receive the Green Flag Community Award. Wales holds a third of the UK's community Green Flag sites.

The Green Flag Award programme is delivered in Wales by environmental charity Keep Wales Tidy, with support from Welsh Government. Independent experts judge sites against eight criteria, including biodiversity, cleanliness, environmental management, and community involvement.

Lucy Prisk, Green Flag Coordinator at Keep Wales Tidy said:

“The pandemic has shown just how important high-quality parks and green spaces are to our communities. For many of us, they have been a haven on our doorstep, benefitting our health and well-being.
