instead to found unorganised one. He seems to have come to carry religion out of the temples into the fields and sheep pastures, onto the roadsides and the banks of the rivers, into the houses of sinners and publicans, into the town and the wilderness, toward the membership of all that is here.' This is bearing witness to the love of God. This is 'loving as I have loved you.'

The Spirit calls us to deepen our friendships. As we do, we expand and broaden our experience of love. We don't always get it right for each other. We make mistakes. We are selfish, but because of God's love for us, we keep at the work of love--together.

There is a story of a child playing happily in the forest until he finds it is beginning to get dark. He starts to feel afraid and cannot find his way to a path out of the forest. Finally, he sees another child and asks if they can help him find the way out. 'No, I'm lost too,' but even as they say that they reach out their hand and take his. Together, perhaps, they find their way out. This is love. This is friendship.

May God bless us with friendships. May God use us to bear witness to God's love.
