This is an award made to gardens which are open to the public which is assessed on the basis of community involvement, good manage-ment and ecological impact. It administered by Welsh Government and Keep Britain Tidy and we were first awarded this in 2021. The award needs annual reapplication assessment. Apply for A Rocha Gold Eco Award

The church has a strong emphasis on eco issues and already holds a sliver Eco church award. As a church we are applying for a gold award with a deadline of 31 January 2025. This application is being made by Beulah Church Eco team led by Eileen Newington with input from lan McDowell, Marianne Barwise and Mary Edwards https://arocha.org.uk/what-we-do/eco-church/

Continue to maintain garden in a sustainable manner

We have a group of volunteers who maintain the garden by work parties from spring to Autumn. We do mow the grass, because it is used by children in the parent and toddler group, with the mower set at a height that allows daisies and clover to thrive.

All vegetation will be composted in a 3 part compost heap located in one corner of the garden which is also used for



vegetable peelings and waste cardboard from the kitchen.

Link with Young People

Our aim is to introduce gardening and love of nature to young people. We plan to continue our link with the junior church to grow runner beans, potatoes in sacks, tomatoes, rhubarb, apples and herbs. This year a new venture will be to grow Gourd bird houses https://www.thompson-morgan.com/p/gourd-bird-house-seeds/wkf7191TM.

Last year the local beaver colony (6-8 yrs old) spent an evening in the garden as part of their gardening badge and we hope to repeat this year. In previous years we have also hosted children with special needs who have come weekly to carry out garden work as of their "service" part component for Duke Edinburgh bronze award and we would be happy to offer this again.

Links with Local Community

The Men's Sheds group that meets in the adjoining workshop will help with garden maintenance projects such as bench maintenance and repair of fencing which has rotted at the base of the posts. Previous projects have

included construction of the compost heap bins, construction of the planters and a hedgehog box.

"Grown not Flown" church flowers

The garden will continue to be a source of flowers and foliage for the church flower arranging team. In the last 2 years we have moved to sustainable flower arranging as marked by the flower festival held in our church "Grown not Flown" September 2022.

Encourage Wildlife and Biodiversity

We will not use any pesticides or herbicides with the exception of a few organic (ferric chloride) slug pellets to protect young bean plants from slugs. We have installed a bug hotel, a bird box and a hedgehog box. We plan to install a further bug hotel and bird box this year.

We plan to take part in the RSPB bird survey in January 2025 and also in international moth week in the last week of July 2025 using a moth trap borrowed from the local scout group.

activities. There will also be a Q&A session with Claire Boot, Synod Property Officer.


There are churches at different stages of the Eco Church journey within our Pastorate and the hope is that the day will provide an opportunity for us to share our stories and ideas.
