Dear Friends,

Long before I, Martha, read the Bible, I knew the song by the Byrds, 'Turn, Turn, Turn.' It was a song of my childhood. It reminds me of summers

driving across the USA or visiting the beaches of Northern California with my family and my father's students. The song is, of course, mostly the words of Ecclesiastes 3.1-8:

To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven:

*A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck
up that which is planted;*

A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up;

A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance;

A time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together;

A time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing;

A time to get, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away;

A time to rend, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak;

A time to love, and a time to hate; a time of war, and a time of peace.

These words came to mind as I sat in a church recently. I was in a building that seats at least 600 people. In contrast, 40 people sat scattered across the pews. As I participated in the service, I wondered about the changes that congregation has seen and what ‘time’ it is for them.

Over the years this church welcomed people to their town from across the world. They

were a safe space for everyone. They oversaw hundreds of weddings and funerals for all sorts of people in the community. They gave space to young people for growth and development. They held hustings and concerts. But, I asked myself, what was their 'time' now? I felt sad for them and wondered how they were

Although many of us may choose to take our holidays 'out of season', we cannot escape the fact that August is a month of difference, whether we are home or away. A couple of weeks ago, we decided to head to North Wales to visit family. Although Rhiwbina has always been my home, I feel a curious sense of belonging as we approach the mountains of Eryri; is it in my DNA or is a nature/nurture thing?

For many years of my childhood, August was the month for an annual family 'pilgrimage' to Rhiwlas, a small village near Bangor, to visit my aunt and cousins, and many extended family close by. This time, I realised that the most memorable things for me are the markers along the way rather than the actual destination – the easiest toilet stops, the picnic places and the detours off the A470. As with other pilgrimages, the journey is always a crucial part of the experience. Whether you have been involved in your own annual August rituals or have experienced the August 'pause' in a different way, I hope you feel refreshed and ready for a change of season and a change of tempo.

In Beulah, August is an opportunity to take a break

from some of the busy-ness of church life but also the chance to tidy up, de-clutter and prepare for the year to come. The Canolfan kitchen has had a deep clean and we already have events to look forward to, when we will make good use of this facility. These include the harvest supper on 19th September and the church family lunch on 4th October to welcome our new elders. Not forgetting our regular community meals on the 4th Sunday of every month.

In the upstairs church office, the bookshelves have been de-cluttered. If you are a regular, or occasional, worship leader or writer of prayers, you will find a dedicated shelf of resources that you may find useful (please borrow & return). There is also a shelf which holds a variety of bible translations which anyone is welcome to access. Thanks to Ann (G), Louise, Eleri Barbara, Anne (J), Martha and everyone who helps to keep us organised.

At the beginning of July, our communion service was one of hope and celebration as Liz Yardley-Richards was welcomed into membership and Nigel Barwise and I were commissioned as church officers (Nigel as Treasurer and me as Secretary). turning and facing into a different season and the obvious changes rushing toward them. Were they letting go, casting away, mourning? Or were they ignoring the 'time.'

As I reflected upon their church life, I wondered about our church. What season/time are we in? Each of the churches in our pastorate are facing challenges: How we do complete the jobs that need to be done? Who are the people who will take on new roles? How to we find the money to build? How do we reach our community? What is it folks want to hear from the church? How do we serve our neighbours in 2026 and beyond?

This brings us to the overarching question: How will we face into change? We, too, could say we have welcomed people, creating a sanctuary of safety for a whole variety of people. Our church has challenged unjust structures of society. We have overseen weddings and funerals and created a community in which children can grow to maturity. Is this where we need to be now or is the season changing? What is God's vision for us? How do we continue to embody God's love in these times of climate crisis and war, in a digital age?

One of my colleagues once told a group of elders life is always changing. For people who disliked change this was a challenging statement. And yet, this is

one of the messages of Ecclesiastes—there are a whole variety of times and stages throughout life; life is always changing. The unwritten message is that God is with us in **all** the times and seasons of life.

Where are you today? In a time of repair, a time of love, a time of mourning, a time of growth? And where are we? What does our church need from each of us for this time?

The image of individuals scattered across a huge building continues to worry me. Is it a metaphor for how they are facing change—divided, alone, lost in it? I hope we can embrace the season ahead in unity. It won't be easy. We might find we have to pluck up a few things and let go of others before we can plant anything. We might have to mourn before we can dance again, but we can do this because God calls us to this community and to each other.

As I face three months of a different routine, I have given myself a question to guide my sabbatical. It is 'What will be revealed?' As we face into the season of the church and our personal lives, can we open ourselves to what will be revealed by God? May we embrace the changes ahead, allowing the creativity of the Spirit to guide us and reveal the work of this season. Blessings for each of you in the times of your lives.

Ian McDowell and Roger Bidnell met the assessor in the spring following a written application.

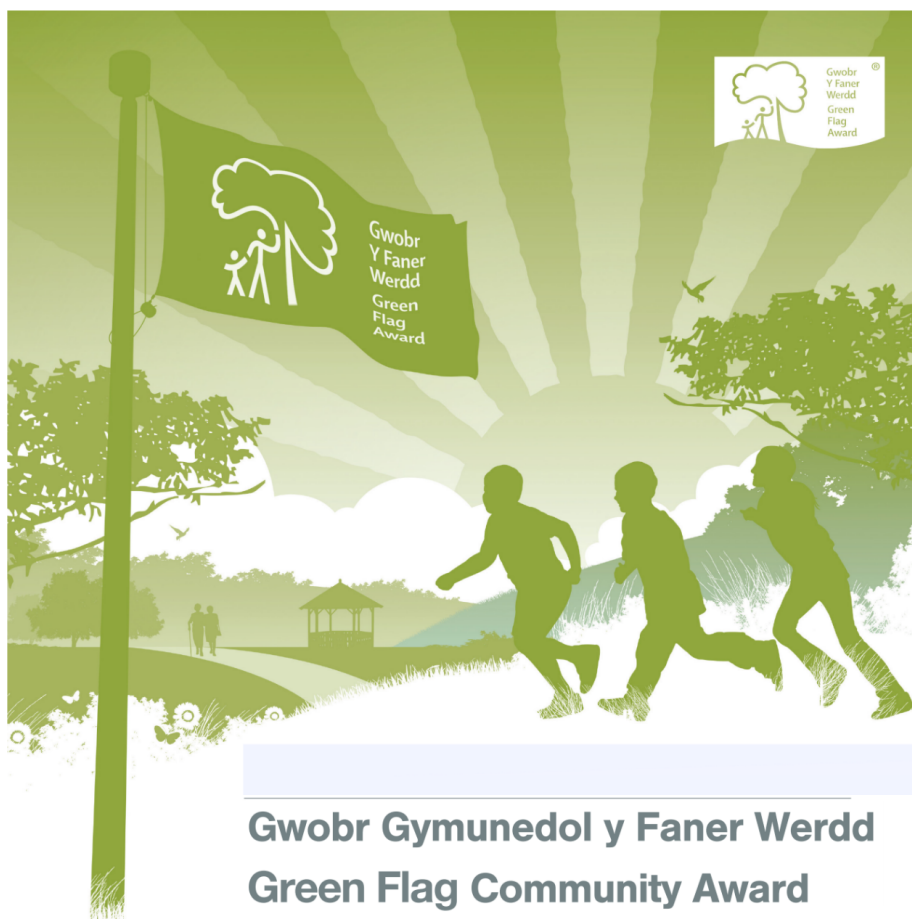
Ann Grimes has looked after our planters and pots this year which add a lot of colour.

Joy of Learning at 5 – a growing charity!

On 7th June 2021 Joy of Learning was registered with the Charity Commission. It had a clear vision – to enable children who had lived at Sanyu Babies' Home, and their siblings, to attend school – but it wasn't until the charity finally secured a bank account in April 2023 that the core work finally started.

Since then, there has been no looking back:

- Joy of Learning is working with 30 families
- 92 children are attending school thanks to international sponsorship
- 76 sponsors contribute every month to make this happen

As the sponsorship programme developed, the needs of the families became clearer. Despite a school place, children could not attend school regularly if they were unwell – often with malaria as they had no mosquito nets – or had rat or snake bites from sleeping on the floor. And so the *Safe Sleep* project was born, to work with one family at a time to provide a safe place for the children to sleep.

So far, Joy of Learning donors have provided:

- 17 triple-decker bunk beds
- 4 double beds
- 54 mattresses
- 54 sets of sheets, pillows, blankets and mosquito nets

Medical bills have been covered, basic foodstuffs have been provided to

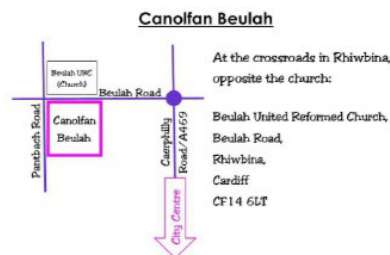

needy families and hygiene needs have been met – without Joy of Learning even bars of soap are an unaffordable luxury.

But to carry on this amazing work, and to carry on growing, Joy of Learning needs our support. So many people have generously given their time and energy to raise money through:

With this impressive growth though comes the need to expand the team – and this is where Joy of Learning needs our help. There are two current vacancies:

Treasurer and Publicity Officer. Could you spare a couple of hours a week and take on one of these important roles, or do you know anyone who might like to get involved?

The role of **Treasurer** includes overseeing all the charity's day to day financial activities and preparing end of year accounts for the annual return. Previous experience of bookkeeping or charity finance would certainly be an advantage but is not essential.

The role of **Publicity Officer** includes keeping the website

up to date, help with the newsletter (usually 4 – 5 issues a year) and involvement with social media if interested. A reasonable level of IT skills is needed.

Please do share this with family and friends, and encourage them to think about volunteering their time. Even a small amount of time can make a big difference.

Those of us who were present at Joy of Learning's 5th Birthday Party saw a video of some of the children who are in school thanks to Joy of Learning's generous sponsors. They announced their name and their class with such pride, and with such huge smiles – a beautiful reminder of why Joy of Learning's work is so important.

Thank you from Pedal Power

A couple of months ago, I started asking for support for a slightly crazy fundraising event for Pedal Power, Cardiff's inclusive cycling charity.

We were going to take over the Maindy velodrome for 12 hours, and get teams of people to ride an endurance relay, non-stop from 6am to 6pm.

Well, on Monday 17th August, we did it! About nine teams, over 80 riders, on bikes, trikes and tandems rode many, many laps of the 450m track. It was a great day to celebrate all kinds of cycling. There were people on folding bikes, on 'shopper' bikes with baskets on the front, children on fancy racing

bikes, profoundly disabled folk on recumbent trikes and of course, a fleet of tandems. Ages of participants ranged from about 11 to 88. The eldest participant, Graeme, led the Welsh cycling road race team at the Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh in 1970! He's the gent in the yellow jersey on the back of the tandem.

Those of you who know our founder Sybil Williams who lives in the village, won't be surprised to hear that as well as riding the track herself, she spent most of the day making tea and handing out donated cake for tired riders.

Was it all worth it? Yes! At time of writing, we had raised over £11,700 (plus gift aid) – which is

fantastic. To all of you who generously supported me, thank you. It all helps keep this amazing charity going. Funding remains a challenge, but Pedal Power keeps making people's lives better.

It's not just about cycling, though that is a big part. Users speak of access to the open air, freedom, friendship and improved mental health. Not to mention a whole range of musical and creative activities and some of the best coffee and cake in the city! If you haven't been, do pop along. You'll find us in the caravan park in Pontcanna Fields, open Tuesday to Sunday.
